Manual handling	Volunteers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Volunteers advised to be aware of their own limitations by the Group Leader during the Induction Briefing and not lift heavy items found during the litter pick. - Volunteers to notify the Group Leader of any large item(s), so that these can be collected by a group of people and a vehicle used to transport the item(s) to the collection point. - Volunteers with pre-existing injuries are not to lift bags or heavy items. - No more than one bag to be carried at a time.
