- Born on the 1<sup>st</sup> April 1957 in Kent, which former England cricket captain now turned commentator was considered to have been one of the most stylish left-handed batsman in the history of the game, bringing him over 8,200 Test match runs between 1978 and 1992? (first name & surname required)

- And finally, so how old will your Quizmaster be when he celebrates his birthday on the 1<sup>st</sup> April this year? For those of you that don't know me personally, the exact date of my Birthday has already been featured in this round, you just need to guess which date? (Please note you can rule out the dates in questions 3 & 4 !!)

# Round 2 - Letter Link

When you get to question 8, the final letter of that answer will be the same as the first letter to the answer to question 1, thus completing the link.

- 7 Which English football league team are nicknamed 'The Black Cats'? SUNDERLAND

In this round all the answers are numbers and the 'sum total' of your 8 answers should be 422

- In Monopoly, how much do you receive for passing GO? **£200**
- Which was the first decimal coin issued in Britain? **50p**
- Which paper size is 210 x 297mm?
- Harry Kane recently surpassed Wayne Rooney's record to become England's top goal scoring international player. What number international career goal did Harry score against Italy to achieve this new record?

- In the UK, a driving licence is issued automatically until the driver reaches what age?70 years old
- 8 How many yards are there in a chain?22 yards

#### Round 4 - Connection

This round consists of 7 general knowledge questions where the answers all have a common connection. For question 8 you simply have to work out what the connection is between the previous 7 answers. All your answers should obviously fit the connection; if you find yourself looking at an answer that doesn't obviously fit the connection then it's either very obscure or, more likely, you've got the wrong answer and you'll need a bit of a re-think!
