- 3 Which 1969 film, based on a stage musical, marked the directorial debut of Richard Attenborough?
- 4 Where do the Flintstones live?
- 5 Which Dickens novel is partly set in America?
- 6 Which Si-Fi film was based on the story *The Sentinel* by Arthur C Clarke?
- 7 Captain Dobbin and Amelia Sedley are characters from which 19th century novel by William Makepeace Thackery
- 8 What was the surname of the squire in Treasure Island?

Round 2 – Letter Link

This round consists of 8 general knowledge questions where the last letter of the answer to question 1 will be the same as the first letter of the answer to question 2, and the final letter of the answer to question 2 will be the same as the first letter of the answer to question 3 and so on so forth down the 8 questions. When you get to question 8, the final letter of that answer will be the same as the first letter to the answer to question 1, thus completing the link.

- 2 The name of which Italian dish translates as 'Cooked cream'?
- 3 The name of which Biblical character means "Father of Many"?
- 4 Dr Douglas C Englebart invented which aid to computing in the 1960's?

- 6 What is a funambulist? (two word answer)
- 7 In which branch of gymnastics do the competitors utilise ribbons and hoops in their routine?
- 8 What does a speleologist study? (plural answer)

Round 3 – Sum total

In this round all the answers are numbers and the 'sum total' of your 8 answers should be 2,204

- 1 During the reign of which King Henry did Columbus discover the New World?
- 2 Which Shakespeare play opens with the line, "If music be the food of love, play on"?
- 3 How many surfaces does a cone have?
- 4 What is the boiling point of water on the Fahrenheit scale?
- 5 How many years are there in a US President's term of office?
- 6 How many rows of stars are there on an American flag, is it 8, 9 or 10
- 7 On the 6th May of which year did Roger Bannister run the first ever sub 4 minute mile, was it 1953, 1954 or 1955?
- 8 How many prime numbers are there between 10 and 20?

Round 4 – Connection

This round consists of 7 general knowledge questions where the answers all have a common connection. For question 8 you simply have to work out what the connection is between the previous 7 answers. All your answers should obviously fit the connection; if you find yourself looking at an answer that doesn't obviously fit the connection then it's either very obscure or, more likely, you've got the wrong answer and you'll need a bit of a re-think!

- 6 What was the nickname of the famous basketball player Earvin Johnson, formerly of the Los Angeles Lakers?
- 7 What was the nickname of the character played by Angie Dickinson in the TV series "*Police Woman*" ?
- 8 What is the connection between the previous seven answers?
