# Round 1 - Quizmaster's Choice - 'Song lyrics'

As the title suggests, this round gives me the chance to put some unusual questions to you. This month I've chosen as the theme 'Song lyrics', so I've given you extracts of the lyrics from 8 famous songs, all you need to do is work who sang them......

- Who, in 1977 sang: 'The sirens are screaming and the fires are howling, Way down in the valley tonight, There's a man in the shadows with a gun in his eye, And a blade shining oh so bright'?
- In 1971, who declared that perhaps he should 'steal my daddy's cue and make a living out of playing pool'?
- Who, in their number 1 hit from February 2007, declared that they wanted to 'let the clocks be reset and the pendulums held'?
- Which group sang about *Terry meeting Julie every Friday night* in a number 2 hit in 1967?
- In April 1971 which group sang; I bet your mama was a tent show queen, and all her boyfriends were sweet sixteen, I'm no schoolboy but I know what I like, You should have heard me just around midnight.?
- In their number 1 hit from July 1979 which group sang *The Telex machine is kept so clean And it types to a waiting world*?
- Which band, in their number 4 hit from October 1986 sang 'Cause it doesn't make a difference if we make it or not. We've got each other and that's a lot for love?
- Which artist mentions three rivers in one of his songs from February 1979 when he sings *With the boys from the Mersey and the Thames and the Tyne*?

## Round 2 - Letter Link

This round consists of 8 general knowledge questions where the last letter of the answer to question 1 will be the same as the first letter of the answer to question 2, and the final letter of the answer to question 2 will be the same as the first letter of the answer to question 3 and so on so forth down the 8 questions. When you get to question 8, the final letter of that answer will be the same as the first letter to the answer to question 1, thus completing the link.

- What was the <u>surname</u> of the TV detective who drove a car with the registration plate 248 RPA?
- Which swash buckling film star was born on 20 June 1909 in Hobart, Tasmania?
- 4 In which American city is Greenwich Village?
- Which state, situated in east central USA, is famous for breeding race horses?
- What was the <u>surname</u> of the American who patented a burglar-proof lock described as 'magic and infallible'?
- 7 Which Jane Austen novel features Mr Knightley and Frank Churchill?
- Taking its name from a French expression, what title is given to an officer selected by a General to carry orders and to assist him in directing movements?

## Round 3 - Sum total

In this round all the answers are numbers and the 'sum total' of your 8 answers should be 2,161

- According to the Bible, Jesus fed a crowd of 5,000 with five loaves and how many fishes?
- 2 How many suspects are there in a game of *Cluedo*?
- Pop Art exponent Andy Warhol once declared 'In the future, everyone will be famous for *how many* minutes'?
- 4 In the 1970s, how many wheels did Tyrell-Ford's Project 34 cars have?
- The names of how many US states begin with a vowel but end in a consonant?
- Which number in line to British throne is Princess Eugenie?
- Given that there are 6 locks on the Panama Canal, what is total number of locks on the Suez Canal and the Panama Canal when added together?
- What is the overall distance in metres run by athletes competing in the decathlon?

## Round 4 - Connection

This round consists of 7 general knowledge questions where the answers all have a common connection. For question 8 you simply have to work out what the connection is between the previous 7 answers. All your answers should obviously fit the connection; if you find yourself looking at an answer that doesn't obviously fit the connection then it's either very obscure or, more likely, you've got the wrong answer and you'll need a bit of a re-think!
