## Round 2 - Letter Link

This round consists of 8 general knowledge questions where the last letter of the answer to question 1 will be the same as the first letter of the answer to question 2, and the final letter of the answer to question 2 will be the same as the first letter of the answer to question 3 and so on so forth down the 8 questions. When you get to question 8, the final letter of that answer will be the same as the first letter to the answer to question 1, thus completing the link.

- What was the <u>surname</u> of the director of the films 2001: A Space Odyessy, A Clockwork Orange and Full Metal Jacket among others? (STANLEY) KUBRICK

- Which notorious school was created by cartoonist Ronald Searle? **ST TRINIAN'S**
- What type of glass, often associated with sherry, shares its name with a type of ship?

## Round 3 – Sum total

In this round all the answers are numbers and the 'sum total' of your 8 answers should be 89

- The postcode of Wimbledon is SW *what*?
- How many stomachs does a cow have?
- 4 How many strings are there on a violin?
- The Black Death, the start of the 100 years war and the Peasants Revolt all occurred in which century? (just the number of the century)

  14<sup>th</sup> (1337 100 years war; 1347 mid 1350s Black Death and 1381 Peasants Revolt led by Wat Tyler)
- Which temperature on the Celsius scale equates to 50° Fahrenheit?
- In basketball and netball, how many feet above the floor is the hoop?
- 8 What is 10% of 20% of 30% of 40% of 50% of 10,000? **12**

## Round 4 - Connection

This round consists of 7 general knowledge questions where the answers all have a common connection. For question 8 you simply have to work out what the connection is between the previous 7 answers. All your answers should obviously fit the connection; if you find yourself looking at an answer that doesn't obviously fit the connection then it's either very obscure or, more likely, you've got the wrong answer and you'll need a bit of a re-think!

- In school terms, which word can go before boy, girl and teacher? **HEAD**
- Which <u>surname</u> is missing from this line-up of a famous rock band; Bonham, Page, Jones and *whom*?

  PLANT
- 3 Created by Oliver Postgate and Peter Firmin, the fictional character who was "King of the Northmen" in a series of books and BBC TV cartoon programmes in the 1960s was called 'Noggin the *what*'?

  NOG
- In the Church of England, what name is given to a clergyman who assists a rector or vicar?

  CURATE
- Which company, formed as a result of an amalgamation between a British company and a Dutch company in 1907, is now the second largest company headquartered in Europe (after Volkswagen) and the 15<sup>th</sup> largest company in the world?

  SHELL
- Which hill, part of the North Downs, and located just north of Dorking is the scene of an important passage in Jane Austen's novel *Emma*? **BOX (HILL)**
- 7 The date of which important Sunday in the Christian calendar can vary between the 21<sup>st</sup> March and the 25<sup>th</sup> April, depending on the date of the vernal equinox? **EASTER**
- What is the connection between the previous seven answers: EGG (Egghead is a general expression for a clever person and, of course, a member of a particularly clever quiz team; Eggplant is the American term for an aubergine; Eggnog is an alcoholic based milk drink; a Curate's egg is something described as partly bad and partly good and the last three are obvious!)
