## Round 2 – Letter Link

This round consists of 8 general knowledge questions where the last letter of the answer to question 1 will be the same as the first letter of the answer to question 2, and the final letter of the answer to question 2 will be the same as the first letter of the answer to question 3 and so on so forth down the 8 questions. When you get to question 8, the final letter of that answer will be the same as the first letter to the answer to question 1, thus completing the link.

- 2 Which city hosted the Centennial Olympic Games? ATLANTA (1996)
- What was the <u>surname</u> of the 18<sup>th</sup> century father and son who were considered to be amongst the finest architects of their day, the son also gaining a reputation as a fine furniture designer **ADAM (father William, son Robert)**
- 4 In the song *My Girl* which month is mentioned by name? **MAY**
- 5 In 1953, Whitehorse took over from Dawson as the capital of which Canadian territory? YUKON
- 6 Which is Italy's third most populated city after Rome and Milan? **NAPLES**
- 7 What name is given to a thin straight surgical knife used in dissection and surgery? SCALPEL
- 8 What is the unit of currency in Bulgaria? **LEV**

## Round 3 – Sum total

In this round all the answers are numbers and the 'sum total' of your 8 answers should be 185

All your answers should obviously fit the connection; if you find yourself looking at an answer that doesn't obviously fit the connection then it's either very obscure or, more likely, you've got the wrong answer and you'll need a bit of a re-think!

- 2 Again, what is the <u>surname</u> of the Apollo 11 astronaut who stayed in the command module when his colleagues Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin stepped onto the surface of the moon for the first time in July 1969? (MICHAEL) COLLINS
- 3 In the context of this connection, which word can go before boy, man, and friend? BEST
- What was the <u>surname</u> of the Secretary of State for Education who introduced teacher training days in the latter part of the 1980s?
  BAKER (AS IN BAKER DAYS)
- 5 On the surface of where have 6 golf balls lay undisturbed since the early 1970s? MOON
- 6 What was the <u>surname</u> of the man who presented the TV programme *Police Five* for many years?
   (SHAW) TAYLOR
- 7 The power usage and brightness of light bulbs is determined by the rating stated on them, which is quoted in which units of measurement? **WATTS**
- 8 What is the connection between the previous seven answers? ALL SURNAMES OF DRUMMERS with bands (Jon Moss of Culture Club, Phil Collins of Genesis, Pete Best originally with The Beatles, Ginger Baker with Cream, Keith Moon of The Who, both Roger Taylor of Queen & Roger Taylor of Duran Duran and finally Charlie Watts of the Rolling Stones)
