

Grant Applications Summary Sheet 2021/22

In 2021/22 PIPC has up to £13,792.40 to spend on all s.137(4)(a) Local Government Act 1972 grants (combined). These are payments where the PC does not have a specific legal power, or duty to incur expenditure. Some of the grant requests below fall outside of s.137, as the PC has a power/duty to act. I have noted these in red. In these cases, there is no financial limit on how much the PC can spend.

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| Billingshurst Emergency Assistance Team (BEAT First Responders) | £500 | £1,000 | Requested: £1,000 Approved/ Recommended: £1,000 | We have multiple sites within the catchment of the parish (Ifold, Durfold Wood, Plaistow Stores, Plaistow & Kirdford Primary School). We will be replacing at least 1 battery and 1 set of electrode pads per year within the area. South East Coast Ambulance Service have restricted the number of devices they help with and the regulatory of such, even for the devices technically owned by them. As the local charity that monitors & maintains the sites, we have carried the cost of replacements as needed and not allowed batteries to fail or electrodes to be left in when out of date, as this would breach clinical rules. A new battery for our most common defibrillator is c.£300 and the electrodes are £35-45 a set. As we have sited a defibrillator with the Plaistow & Kirdford Primary School we would ask for support to the costs of the cabinet for installation at this site, which is £528. We have also carried the costs of providing a defibrillator to the school from existing funds (c.£1,100). We would appreciate the Parish Council's support to continue to provide Public Access Defib sites and to maintain all of those within the parish. |

Due to a sewage leak last summer, our whole outside play area was destroyed and all resources, both fixed and freestanding, including the soft surfacing had to be disposed of. The loss of our outside area was due to circumstances entirely beyond our control and has greatly affected the play space for our children who have had to use |

Once the hall reopens to other users as lockdown eases, our use of this area and the equipment we can use will become very restricted. Total estimated cost of the project - circa £10,000. |

| Winterton Hall (Annual Grant) Not s.137 grant | £1,500 | £1,500 | Requested: £1,500 Approved/ Recommended: £1,500 | The Parish Council has traditionally provided funds to enable the hall to have lower hall hire rates than it would otherwise have. Provision of this money directly benefits all residents who use the hall. |
| Plaistow Youth Club | £1,500 | £1,500 | Requested: £1,500 Approved/ Recommended: £1,500 | We provide a weekly Youth Club for children 11-18 and monthly Youth Club to children 9-11. We request funding to help support the general running of the Youth Club. We are in the process of changing our heating from night storage to controllable electric heaters. We have also been asked by local users to increase the external lighting. We would also like to plan some exciting event for the re-opening of the Youth Club. The electricity and lighting we estimate £1200 with the remaining grant going towards the general running of the Youth Club. |
