

## Lady Hope Playpark

The Lady Hope Playpark is currently undergoing a £55,000 refurbishment and will be officially re-opened by special guests at the Parish Council's Annual Assembly on Saturday 16th October. Please do save the date and come along.

Last year, users of the playpark were asked to participate in an online public consultation. The Parish Council has listened carefully to the feedback in order to create an exciting new design! In addition to the new design, a zip-wire will be situated on the upper green, running in parallel to Common House Lane aside the hedgerow.

Redlynch Leisure have ensured that access to the playpark is restricted for the duration of the works. The works are taking place in three stages by three different teams. First the removal of the old equipment and ground preparation; second the installation of the new equipment and third the safety matting is being installed under the new and remaining equipment. The aerial runway (zip-wire) is being installed at the same time on the upper green. It will run along the hedge of Common House Lane (here) where there is a natural slope.



## **Public Consultation**

Plaistow & Ifold Parish Council undertook a local consultation amongst residents of Durfold Wood, Ifold, Plaistow and Shillinglee during the first three weeks of June this year to gather feedback from residents and those who use the services and facilities, such as the playpark and schools.

Why was this done? The Parish Council has the ability to spend some of the council tax money collected by Chichester District Council – the Precept – on local activities and issues that matter locally. The consultation was to help identify where to spend this money and the priorities for services & facilities required as the focus for our community.

The consultation exercise was an important initiative for the Parish Council and the community and has enabled some strong direction and focus on areas to investigate across recreation, transport, cycling, local bus services, and the provision and maintenance of bridleways and footpaths.

## Neighbourhood Plan

The additional Habitats Regulations Appraisal (HRA) on our neighbourhood plan, triggered by Natural England's concern over the accumulative impact on fresh water supplies in the North Sussex area from extraction at Hardham has been completed by CDC in June 2021. The HRA concludes that there is likely to be a cumulative adverse impact and it recommends measures to control water consumption on new housing, as proposed by Natural England.

Janet Cheesley, the appointed Examiner, has now seen the HRA and re-opened her examination. In an 'open letter' (08-07-21) she states that Neighbourhood Plans are prohibited (by a Ministerial decision) from making local technical requirements on new housing. Therefore, our NP can't meet the requirements of the HRA and so can't meet the Basic Conditions test. Therefore, she cannot recommend the Plan goes forward to Referendum.

The Steering Group has sought professional advice on this matter. They have advised that the Parish Council obtains further Grant assistance for professional advice from AECOM Infrastructure & Environment. They also advise that, in conjunction with CDC, the Parish Council advises the Examiner that we want to suspend the Examination to allow time to determine whether there is an alternative course of action open to the Parish Council. In addition, CDC have informed the Parish Council that they are seeking their own legal advice for the wider implications of the Examiner's letter.

# Community Speed Watch

In the past 9 months the Community Speed Watch have recorded 17% of drivers exceeding 35mph along the Plaistow Road in Ifold. That is 35,702 vehicles. And for all vehicles exceeding the speed limit of 30mph this figure goes up to 49%, a staggering 94,950 vehicles. Sussex has 280 registered CSW groups across the county and Sussex Police are sending out approximately 7000 letters to offenders a week to support these groups. The local group will collect about 30 offenders' details in an hour on the roadside. Many of the details collected are of those that live in the parish.

So why should you bother to adhere to the speed limit? At speeds between 30 and 40mph, 85% of pedestrians will not survive a collision. There are no pavements through Ifold and many parts of Plaistow, consequently pedestrians are very vulnerable - that is our children going to school, our elderly walking to the shop, our neighbours out running and dog walkers. Speeding vehicles cause fear and intimidation and mean that residents drive rather than walk and drive their children to school. Not good for us or the environment.

Please help the Parish to be a better and safer place to live by observing the speed limits. If you commit to abiding by the speed limit you have a knock-on effect slowing other vehicles behind you too. Please think about it and slow down.

# Ifold Bus Stop Conservation Project

#### **VOLUNTEERS WANTED**

The Parish Council is working with Ifold Estates Ltd to revamp The Drive, Ifold bus stop area. After all, it's currently an unsightly derelict mess! However, with the guidance of Butterfly Conservation and support of Natural Gardens the aim is to turn it into a bio-diverse conservation heaven for our rare Wood White butterfly and other minibeasts.

#### How can you help with the project?

As part of this project and the Parish Council's ongoing Safer Bus Stop initiative the current bus shelter on the site will be carefully dismantled and a new bespoke timber shelter will be built at a different location on the site. Some of the existing shelter materials will be retained to be reused. We are looking for volunteers who can help to dismantle the bus shelter, help with scrub clearance and, of course, plant up the area in the spring!

### **Grants**
