The fire hydrant indicated on the site layout plan should be installed in the agreed position, ready for use on the site, prior to occupation of the new chalet bungalow. Notify West Sussex Fire & Rescue Service once it is ready for use as a private fire hydrant.

The details have been reviewed in consultation with West Sussex County Highways and the Council's Environmental Protection Officer who have considered the details to be acceptable.

However, due to a recent High Court Judgement (CG Fry & Sons Ltd v SSLuHC), it is not possible to discharge the condition. The judgement makes clear that applications to approve details reserved by conditions are subject to Habitats Regulation Assessments (HRA) where one has not previously been carried out for all current issues, in this case, protected bats.

Bats

The proposal relates to a project within the 6.5km Zone of Influence for The Mens Special Area of Conservation (SAC) and Ebernoe Common Special Area of Conservation (SAC) designated for important Barbastelle and Bechstein's bat species.
