

**Re Adams cottage** none of the trees are subject to TPO's but are in the conservation area. The Ash trees show extensive die back and should be felled. The large Ash trees show extensive in the front has hardly any leaves.

I could not see the apple or bay tree easily to make a judgement but if the Apple is leaning then it makes sense to fell before it falls over.

I have no problem with work suggested for the Oak trees show extensive.

The property has a copse as part of the property with a number of mature trees.

I think despite the number of existing trees it would not be unreasonable to ask for some replacements to be planted to replace those being felled.

**Re Hickory Hollow.** I have no objections to any of the planned work. I could see the dead beech, which is shown in the accompanying photographs.

One of the Oaks T 6, at the front, is overhanging the neighbours property and is almost touching their roof

My only concern is the power lines that run through both Oak trees at the front as well as telephone lines. I would have thought the relevant electricity company may want to be consulted and ensure the work is carried out without danger to the electricity supply.
