- 6 What is the main ingredient of Welsh laverbread (known as bara lafwr or bara lawr in Welsh)? (LAVER) SEAWEED
- 7 What was the anglicised first name and surname of the Welsh leader who instigated a fierce and long-running war of independence with the aim of ending English rule in Wales during the Late Middle Ages. He was the last native Welshman to hold the title Prince of Wales? **OWEN GLENDOWER**
- 8 Which Welsh rugby union player became the most capped player of all time when he led his team out against New Zealand in October 2021? (all three names required so there's a clue!)
 ALUN WYN JONES

Round 2 – Letter Link

This round consists of 8 general knowledge questions where the last letter of the answer to question 1 will be the same as the first letter of the answer to question 2, and the final letter of the answer to question 2 will be the same as the first letter of the answer to question 3 and so on so forth down the 8 questions. When you get to question 8, the final letter of that answer will be the same as the first letter to the answer to question 1, thus completing the link.

All your answers should obviously fit the connection; if you find yourself looking at an answer that doesn't obviously fit the connection then it's either very obscure or, more likely, you've got the wrong answer and you'll need a bit of a re-think!
